OPEN SCIENCE TO BOOST SCIENTIFIC EXCELLENCE IN EUROPE
OPEN SCIENCE AS A PATH TO DEMOCRATISE ACCESS TO KNOWLEDGE
SOCIAL APPROPRIATION OF SCIENCE

Based on the discussion and results from the Brussels's Preparatory Meeting for the Open Science Conference under the Dutch Presidency of the Council of the EU from 4 to 5 April 2016 in Amsterdam, this meeting will focus on the articulation of conclusions to be adopted by the Competitiveness Council in May. Open Access to scientific publications and to scientific data agenda with a focus on the share/re-use concept, new methods and a more inclusive way of production/construction, validation and dissemination of knowledge.

We will learn from previously selected case studies related to each of the action lines outlined above. The framework proposed fits conceptual and experimental projects that interconnect open science with social and cultural demands and incentives, putting in perspective the traditional scientific workflow. The approximation between science and culture should be explicitly motivated.

A concerted strategy at this level may enable the enlargement of the social support for science — while stimulating scientific culture and literacy processes — resulting in substantial changes in the cadence of the open science appropriation. Reflection on Open Science and its practicalities should include, but also go beyond the knowledge transfer debate. The meeting proposes a complementary path — "learning open science with the society", highlighting the above mentioned broader societal perspective as the path to follow, but also underlining the importance of "openness" in all its facets (knowledge sharing, use and associated ownership and intellectual property issues). In sum, touching upon the structural obstacles in the context of a networked knowledge economy.

The addressing and involvement of the relevant stakeholders such as the Members States, the European institutions and the knowledge institutions are key to the success of the meeting as a concerted strategy to enlarge the social support for science - while stimulating scientific culture and literacy processes - resulting in substantial changes in the cadence of the open science appropriation needs to be implemented by the relevant institutions and organisations at various levels.
